Elementary Band!

What is Elementary Band?

Elementary Band is an activity that will allow you to learn a band instrument together along with students from Ella Baker, Rosa Parks, and Wilder Elementary Schools!

A band instrument? Which ones?

This year, we will start flute, clarinet, trumpet, trombone, alto saxophone, and percussion.

Percussion? You mean drums, right?

Percussion is <u>NOT</u> "drums". In band, musicians who learn percussion learn a variety of different instruments. At the elementary level, this begins with mallets (bells/xylophone) and snare drum.

I'm not sure which instrument is which?

Who can join?

This program is for all interested 4th and 5th grade students.

I've already been playing for a bit. Can I still join?

Absolutely! We will have instruction available for both beginners and experienced musicians.



How is band going to work?

We will start the year online with TEAMS. Instruction will be a combination of live meetings and access to instructional videos.

Will we get to meet in-person?

At some point, yes, but we don't know when and we don't know how. When we get closer to when that can be a possibility, the band teachers will have a discussion as to how to best have inperson instruction.

What will I need for rehearsal?

You will need your instrument, your book, and a pencil. Also, a folding music stand and a metronome are **HIGHLY** recommended

Which book do I need?

We will use <u>Essential Elements Interactive</u>, <u>Book 1</u>. Make sure you get the right book for your instrument.

What are the class expectations?

In order to make the most of your band experience, it is recommended that you:

- Plan on a **year-long** commitment. New instruments often take time to learn. If an instrument really isn't working for you, let me know and we might work something out.
- Participate in live meetings and practice assignments
- Come prepared with ALL materials
- Practice **regularly** at home (aim for 30 min./day)



Do I need any accessories for my instrument?

Your rental store can provide you with instrument care kits that you will need to maintain your instrument. This should include:

- Flute: cleaning rod and soft cloth
- Clarinet: cork grease, a drop-through cleaning cloth, and a minimum of FIVE #2 clarinet reeds
- Alto Sax: cork grease, drop-through cleaning cloth, and a minimum of FIVE #2 alto sax reeds
 - Trumpet: valve oil, slide grease, polish cloth
- Trombone: slide oil, tuning slide grease, polish cloth
- Percussion: bell kit, practice pad, 5A/SD1 snare sticks, M14/M5 mallets
